Cut through at WAFB and to avoid Memorial Drive. The road is very narrow. Snow banks cause the road to narrow even more, excess traffic through this area is unnecessary. Convert Old Lyman Road to a one way street. Fergus Marshall, 55 Gaylord Street, Eversource is petitioning for pipes. Pipelines will be paid for by the ratepayers. Should be protecting children. We must change the way we do business. New pipes don't need to be done. How much study has gone into this project? Need more scrutiny, send for further study before approval. Dave Boiselle, 117 Deljordy Lane, trying to not be personal about this. Don't know what the WMDC representatives do. Property was sold off without going to the public. Respect the Mayor and who he appoints. Need new faces.

--Motion made by Councilor Tillotson to receive and refer to the Human Resource Committee. Councilor Tillotson stated reason for doing this is because the person in public input asked. Not opposed to letting the people have an opportunity to ask questions. Felt Ms. Laflamme and Mr. Czepiel have done their job. Council gets last word when it comes to a Zone Change. Councilor Courchesne stated thank Councilor Tillotson for sending to committee, public input is not for back and forth. Councilor Pniak-Costello stated

thank all the individuals that have been coming out and sharing their concerns, you will hear background, this is transparency. Very fortunate to have activists in our community. Councilor McAuliffe made a motion to approve the appointment. All have been aware of what has been going on the last year and a half. Been going on for too long in this format. Reached out to WMDC, has a commitment from them to meet with residents and the Council. Want to find a compromise. Believe the re-appointments have been doing what they have been asked. Part of a group that wants to find compromise. Think this is the best way forward. Councilor Roy stated with Councilor McAuliffe, two of the most dedicated people in the city. Councilor Dobosz stated thank everyone that has shown up this evening. We've been through quite a bit in the last year and a half, since December 2012 the Slate Conservation area. Area was sold to WMDC for pennies on the dollar. Been an incredible battle. President of WMDC told the Council there were no plans for development. Documents posted on the city website. WMDC has put in cameras and the President of WMDC has never spoken to Councilor Dobosz. Doesn't benefit anyone to not compromise. Don't believe residents should have to do the first gesture of good will. If it goes to committee both sides will be able to speak. Believe they should go to committee. Is a disgrace after all the lies, lies were told on the record. Intimidation tactics used, should go to committee. Councilor McAuliffe stated little difference of opinion on this but utmost respect. Need a diplomatic re-set. Best interest of the council to move forward. Sit down with the board members and president of WMDC, best path forward. The way we communicate with residents needs to be changed. Councilor Courchesne stated he is confused as to why there is such a rush to move this tonight, what is three weeks? Doesn't sound transparent, don't get why the questions can't be answered on this. Councilor Lopez stated public has clearly stated they want their voices to be heard. Public has time and again let us know they want their voices to be heard. We should respect Councilor Dobosz for standing up for his constituents. Huge interest in letting the public be heard. Councilor Zygarowski stated just want to say a few words, understand the residents, and understand Councilor Dobosz. Councilor McAuliffe has spoken to the appointees and Mr. Bolton. Councilor Dobosz applaud you for the fight you've had for your constituents. To call the council a disgrace is out of line. Councilor Dobosz stated did say it would be a disgrace to just appoint these members tonight. Respect Marie Laffamme, don't know Mr. Czepiel. One disaster after another, don't want an amazon warehouse where our state park is supposed to be. Do believe in compromise, don't believe the constituents should be the first to give. High interest among the public, hard to bring up everything that has happened over a year and a half. Original plans is not in the best interest of the city or its residents. Councilor Roy stated are inspired by dedication, putting these people on trial? What do we gain? What do we accomplish? Degrading to people. Councilor Labrie stated don't think the Human Resource committee is the proper place for the forum. Been on for 8 years will the right people be there? Don't know if everyone will show. May not be the right forum. Councilor Lopez stated want to address Councilor Labrie, response, perhaps Human Resource Committee isn't the right channel. Appointing tonight is not the right channel. And Councilor Roy stating putting them on trial is completely erroneous, to state they will be put on trial, they will be asked questions by the public. Trust the chair enough to run a good meeting, appointments should not go through today. Councilor McAuliffe stated he is losing the debate, tried to remove the rhetoric. Everyone has valid viewpoints. Don't think HR is the correct forum, there is no back and forth. Trying to propose after the point, respect differences of opinion. Human Resource committee is not the correct forum for this. Don't get crosstalk in committee. Will go in circles all night. Councilor Brooks stated agree with hybrid approach because committee is not the correct place to send this. Go to subcommittee and Mayor, work with WMDC to hold a public meeting. Believe WMDC is required to put this on an agenda, would be appropriate dialogue. Will research what recourse to get on the agenda. Councilor Courchesne stated questions on the HR committee are directed at the candidates. Councilor Tillotson stated his motion is still on the floor. That's the process they go to the Human Resource committee. He can let people talk, will be run fairly. Don't believe we will change the process. Talk to these commissioners. It will be the will of the board to let the public have input. No rules for how subcommittee is run. Always
