Public Input— Marie Asselin, 147 Deane Street, her and her husband David have lived in Chicopee for 32 years, like to speak about the one-way sign on Old Lyman Road. Public safety hazard for more than 30 years, was a racetrack for many years. The speed was horrific and constant. Put a boulder in front of the house, then a rock wall, speeders came through. Thank Councilor Pniak-Costello, she sat in her car and counted traffic. Short cut to avoid the lights on Memorial Drive. Sought advice from Engineer and DPW, the road was declared unsafe. Since the sign has been put in, the traffic has been cut by 80%. A one-way sign was a quick and perfect solution. Lisa Bienvenue, 34 Edbert Street, traffic speeding and traffic patterns are a big topic of discussion. In July of 1971 Thomas Furtek was killed on Memorial Drive, long history of speeding on Memorial Drive. Meetings for Burnett Road and Old Lyman Road, much has been said about speeding and safety. Some roads are designed to move safely and some are to keep traffic moving, for residents of Ward 6 safety is the main concern. Have to think about planning and the future. Speeding is a wonderful target, about full vision for the city. David Bennett, 94 St. Jacques Road, incident with a couple busses on Old Lyman Road, years ago the mirrors locked together. No one could get on the bus, no one could get off the bus. The principal or vice principal of Bowie School and the bus company had to come and help. Jane Alexander, Thomas Street, follow-up for sign request. Glad the Police Department will be putting a C-3 unit in Willimansett. Speeding on the street, get retaliated on, don't get a response from Councilor Courchesne. Call the police but have to worry about retaliation. Neighbors are afraid to come out. Need support. Need a sign. Can't go months without seeing the police. None of the ordinances are being followed through. Have to stop the scum, get them off the street. You have more power. Kids will be voters, want to be able to go outside. Joe Brady, Old Lyman Road, professional engineer that the city pays to survey says they don't meet the standard for a two-way road. People are going the wrong way. Not an engineer, not a cop, not a fireman, just think making it back to a two-way street will cause problems.

Councilor Courchesne stated the engineer is never going to approve this sign. If you look at this sign it is exactly at the end of a driveway. There is nowhere you can park, was discussed before the meeting. Councilor Tillotson stated engineer didn't think it was a good idea. Will take care of it this month. If the council agrees to go along then fine. Councilor Courchesne stated it is simple, moved sign six feet to the left. Trying to help this resident out. No parking on the left. Engineer can't legally approve this. Councilor Krampits stated CEL doesn't want any type of signs on their poles. Councilor Laflamme stated agree with Councilor Lopez right now, he can't approve because half the poles are CEL and half are Verizon. Can't approve without Verizon.
